We recognise that we need to succeed in our aims and objectives by using principles from international development alongside human rights frameworks; we believe both approaches should **always include sexual and gender minorities**. About the role and the project:

We are looking for a compassionate, proactive, and community-focused Project Worker to support the delivery of OUT and Safe North East, a weekly drop-in space for LGBTQ+ migrants. Based at the Pride Media Centre in Gateshead, this project offers a safe and supportive environment where LGBTQ+ individuals from migrant, refugee, and asylum-seeking backgrounds can access community, connection, and support. This drop-in will support newly arrived and existing refugees, migrants, and people seeking asylum, to integrate into their new surroundings and to overcome some of the specific difficulties they face as LGBTQ+ people. It will provide: Weekly contact support via a drop-in group, offering group activities and one-to-one support. This will be a warm space where we can offer LGBTQ+ workshops, talks, mental health and well-being activities, integration tasks, local orientation, advice on LGBTQ+ specific issues, and advocacy support to tackle homophobia and to work to tackle hate crime, raising awareness of it amongst group members, who often do not know national laws about this. Signposting to other services such as counselling and PTSD support, with local partner organisations. Working alongside another Project Worker and trained ReportOUT volunteers, alongside a monitoring group made up of professionals, you will plan and deliver engaging weekly sessions, provide advice and signposting, and foster a welcoming, inclusive space.

Contractual status

This is a self-employed position. If successful, the contractor will be responsible for managing their own tax, National Insurance contributions, and VAT (if applicable). ReportOUT will not deduct tax at source. This post is subject to a satisfactory Enhanced DBS Check.

Key Responsibilities

- Encourage the drop-in to thrive and grow.
- Deliver weekly drop-in sessions alongside a co-worker and volunteers.
- Successful volunteer management and supervision of a small and motivated team of volunteers.
- Create a safe, inclusive, engaged, varied, and welcoming space for LGBTQ+ migrants from all backgrounds.
- Provide one-to-one advice, emotional support, and referrals.
- Keep clear records of attendance, engagement, and session feedback.
- Contribute to project monitoring and evaluation.
- Promote the service across relevant networks and communities, forming close relationships with them.
- Keep the project monitoring group informed of progress, using their referral methods when needed.
- Uphold safeguarding, confidentiality, anonymity, and professional boundaries at all times.
- Take part in additional activities (which may fall on different times and dates), when needed.

Person specification:

Essential criteria:

- Experience working with LGBTQ+ people and/or migrant communities.
- Understanding of the varied backgrounds and intersectional challenges faced by LGBTQ+ migrants in the UK.
- Very strong interpersonal and communication skills, which includes the ability to build trust and rapport with diverse individuals.
- Group facilitation experience, with the ability to deliver varied drop-in session ideas to cover all interests and needs.
- Commitment to inclusivity, anti-racism, and trauma-informed practice including strong cultural awareness.
- Able to work independently, to be responsive, and to take initiative.
- Knowledge of referral processes, including safeguarding policies and procedures.
- Experience with evaluation, monitoring, and reporting methods.
- · Strong organisational and time management skills.
- Strong MS Office skills, including Microsoft Outlook, Teams, Word, Forms.

Desirable:

- Lived experience as an LGBTQ+ person and/or migrant (highly desirable).
- Multilingual skills in either official state languages and/or regional dialects.
- Familiarity with local support services in the North East.
- · First aid or mental health first aid trained.
- Community campaign skills.
- Ability, or willingness to learn, SharePoint software for updates to the wider team.
